Town Code for Public Nuisances

As summer approaches, our police department will be issuing citations for environmental public nuisances. An environmental public nuisance is defined in our town code as “Any growth of weeds, grass, or other rank vegetation on private or governmental property which is neglected, disregarded or not cut, mown, or otherwise removed and/or which has attained a height of nine inches or more.” If you are not in compliance, a citation will be issued to the owner of record with a compliance date. If weeds are not maintained by the compliance date, fines will be assigned. If you have any questions regarding the town’s environmental public nuisance ordinance or want to report a public nuisance, please contact the non-emergency number of the Cedar Lake Police Department at 219-374-5416.

Mosquito Spray Day and Procedures

Mosquitoes are an all-too-familiar summer nuisance. Together, we can have a much more enjoyable summer experience in our community. This year, the mosquito sprayer will be making its rounds on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 7 p.m. and 11 p.m. It will proceed down every other road, alternating east and west sides of the lake. The mosquito spray is safe for humans and all animals. However, it is susceptible to weather conditions. Should the weather prevent a treatment, spraying will continue as soon as possible. The operators of our mosquito abatement program are licensed and certified by the State Chemist Office to safely and effectively administer mosquito control exercises. Any mosquito abatement, used in the Town of Cedar Lake, is under strict regulation and supervision, and assuredly is safe for humans and animals both domestic and non-domestic. While town employees will not treat private property, here are a few steps you can do at home: all mosquitoes need water to complete their life cycle. Empty water-holding containers, i.e. old tires, bird baths, kiddie pools, cans, and bins. Keeping lawns and lots mowed short can also prevent mosquito infestation.



Town of Cedar Lake, The Crown Point Community Foundation, and Hanover Township Trustee’s Office saw a need to bring relief to the citizens we served by having an emergency shelter trailer in our community that will serve the citizens immediately after a disaster. The trailer stores and transports two portable shelter carts which each contain all the supplies to set up an individual emergency shelter for 25 people. The trailer also has a police/fire dispatch station, which can be used in case the main dispatch center is inoperable. The Cedar Lake VIPS would like to give a special thank you to those organizations who made donations for the trailer.

Garbage & Recycling

GMI Services will be providing garbage and recycling services for the Town of Cedar Lake beginning Monday, June 1, 2015. Service will continue to be on Mondays for both garbage and recycling. In the upcoming weeks, GMI Services will begin delivering trash and recycling totes to every residence that has the town’s sanitation service. Please ensure that your trash and recycling is out by 6 a.m. for a smooth transition to our new provider.



Emergency Shelter Trailer

On May 19, 2015, the Cedar Lake Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) unveiled their emergency shelter trailer, which will service the community of Cedar Lake and unincorporated Hanover Township. After seeing recent natural disaster events in neighboring states, the Cedar Lake VIPS, along with NIPSCO,
