

Fire Department on Grill Safety

Fire in the grill, under hot dogs and burgers, is a welcome sight at the family cookout. But fire anywhere else can make your summer kick-off barbecue memorable for all the wrong reasons. The National Fire Protection Association shares some general grilling tips to keep you and your family safe this summer: propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors, the grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches, keep children and pets away from the grill area, keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill and never leave your grill unattended. Guy Colonna, NFPA Division Manager, Industrial & Chemical Engineering, gives some basic tips on how to prepare your grill before your first cookout of the season.

- Check the major connection points between the gas (propane) tank hose and the regulator and cylinder, and where the hose connects to the burners. Tighten if loose.
- Check the gas (propane) tank hose for the potential (gas) leaks. To do that:

 Turn the propane tank on. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose using a brush or spray bottle. If there is a gas leak, the propane will release bubbles around the hose (big enough to see).
- Once you've determined your grill has a gas leak by smell or by administering the soapy bubble test and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and burners. If the leak stops at that point, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak doesn't stop, call the fire department immediately.
- If you smell gas while cooking, move away from the grill and call the fire department immediately. Do not move the grill.

Swimming Pool Ordinance

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission estimates a startling number of children are injured each year in residential swimming pools and spas. As the summer months are well underway, pool safety is a hazard we can address by taking a proactive approach. Cedar Lake's Town Code defines a swimming pool as: "An outdoor structure having a depth at any point of more than two (2) feet, whether such structure is built "in-ground", "above-ground", or any combination thereof (swimming pools of a smaller size shall be deemed "wading pools" and are not regulated)". The Town Code also requires all such swimming pools to be completely enclosed by a fence. The structural sides of an above ground swimming pool may be used in satisfying a portion of the fence height requirement. In all cases, a minimum height of five (5) feet shall be used to enclose the swimming pool itself or a continuous barrier to the portion of the yard where the swimming pool is located. Pools also have specific electrical requirements and are not allowed within ten (10) feet of any side or rear lot line. Always obtain a building permit before constructing any type of pool or fence.
