School's In, Speed's out!

Clerk-Treasurer's Ongoing Education

Deputy Clerk Pam Castner has earned the Certified Municipal Clerk designation from the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC). She was presented the honor at a recent Indiana League of Municipal Clerks and Treasurers (ILMCT) conference held in French Lick. The certification requires earning 60 points for education and 50 points for experience for a total of 110 points. The applicant must also be a member of the IIMC in good standing for a minimum of two years.

Continuing education is an important factor in the Clerk-Treasurer's Office as trends and laws continuously change in Indianapolis. Deputy Margo Nagy earned the Certified Municipal Clerk designation in 2013. Clerk-Treasurer Amy Gross advanced to earning the Master Municipal Clerk designation in 2014, and received the Certified Public Manager certification by attending a two-year course through Ball State University, Bowen Center for Public Affairs. She continues to strive for further education while attending courses at Indiana Wesleyan University. This next journey of learning is a personal goal for Amy being earned on her own time and with no taxpayer dollars.
