Putting in a fence? Planting a tree? Installing a mailbox? Whatever home improvement or landscaping project you're planning, whether you do it yourself or hire a professional, call 811 before you dig.


Dig safely and wield your tools wisely, because underground electric, gas and other utility lines are much closer to the surface than you think. Make the toll-free call to 811 at least two business days before your next project to have the lines marked for free.

Protect Local Water Quality

One goal of Cedar Lake's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Program is raising awareness for Town residents, businesses and visitors on how their actions can impact stormwater quality. With respect to our local drainage ditches, please take a few minutes to review how each of us can help protect local water resources. Our local drainage ditches are critical components of Cedar Lake's stormwater conveyance system. For these critical conveyance systems to function properly, the Town Staff performs periodic inspections of local ditches and works with Cedar Lake Public Works Staff to clear obstructions. During our inspections, we have found grass clippings, yard waste, discarded tires, trash and debris dumped in and along the banks of local ditches. Along with reducing the conveyance capacity of local drainage ways, decaying yard debris such as grass clippings, branch cuttings and leaves in waterways can release nutrients leading to weed and algae growth, using up oxygen. This can lead to oxygen depletion. Simple steps that you can take to actively protect our local water quality include: no dumping, blowing or sweeping yard waste into ditches, streets, or storm drains. Leave grass clippings on your lawn to act as a natural fertilizer, storm drain, or soil conditioner, producing mulch for flower beds and gardens. Bag or containerize waste for yard waste collection. Thank you for considering these simple steps to protect Cedar Lake's water quality!







Bartlett-Wahlberg Park The Cedar Lake Town Council has been busy putting together a design for Bartlett-Wahlberg Park which is located on the north end of Cedar Lake on Lake Shore Drive. This expansion is made possible through the use of Tax Increment Funds and Park Impact Fee Funds; local tax dollars were not used to purchase the land. Public Works Staff cleared the lots and builders in the community have donated the fill needed. Watch for work to begin in the near future.



School Zones We are reminding you to pay attention in school zones. When sharing the roads with buses, leave extra room between you and the bus. Stop when you are behind the bus and the crossing arm is extended; drivers should only stop if facing the bus on a two-lane roadway, two-lane road way with center lane, or four-lane road way without median separation. Make sure to obey posted speed signs and help keep our kids safe during the new school year!
