- The average household's leaks can account for more than 10,000 gallons of water wasted every year, or the amount of water needed to wash 270 loads of laundry.
- Common types of leaks found in the home include worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets, and leaking showerheads. All are easily correctable.
- Fixing easily corrected household water leaks can save homeowners on their water bills.
- A showerhead leaking at 10 drips per minute wastes more than 500 gallons per year. That's the amount of water it takes to wash 60 loads of dishes in your dishwasher.
 - A leaky faucet that drips at the rate of one drip per second can waste more than 3,000 gallons per year. That's the amount of water needed to take more than 180 showers!
 - An irrigation system that has a leak 1/32nd of an inch in diameter (about the thickness of a dime) can waste about 6,300 gallons of water per month.

Leak Detection

- One way to find out if you have a toilet leak is to place a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. If the color shows up in the bowl within 15 minutes without flushing, you have a leak. Make sure to flush immediately after this experiment to avoid staining the tank.
- Leaky faucets can be fixed by checking faucet washers and gaskets for wear and replacing them if necessary.



Winter is here, and so is the ice and snow. The following information is to notify the public about the Town of Cedar Lakes' snow removal and plowing procedures. First and foremost, the snow plows remove the snow from the roads by means of pushing it, not by picking it up. This means the snow is pushed to the sides of the road. Second, the efficiency of the salt dropped by the trucks is limited by weather conditions and traffic as salt is ineffective at twenty degrees or colder.

The priorities for which roads get attention first are as follows: Main roads of travel, secondary roads that still receive high amounts of traffic, steep and high hills that are difficult for vehicles

during inclement weather, and finally all remaining streets.

Renewat ag

Dog owners are required to renew their licenses annually at the Clerk-Treasurer's Office located at 7408

Constitution Avenue during business hours, Monday-Friday 8AM-5PM.

During the months of January through March 31st, the cost is \$10 per dog with a maximum of three dogs permitted at each residence. After March 31st, the cost will be \$15 per dog. A valid rabies certification is required in order to renew the license. It is the responsibility of the dog owner to ensure that the rabies shots are renewed per veterinarian's certificate. For those who are unable to come to the Town Hall to renew the dog license, we will accept a copy of the valid rabies certificate, and payment by check, through the mail or the drop box at our parking lot. Upon receipt of your information and payment, we will process your license and mail it to you. For more information, please call our office at (219) 374-7000.

It is important that any obstructions on private property be removed from the road-way prior to snow plowing. This is imperative for two reasons, quicker passes and the prevention of damage to private property. Obstructions can range anywhere from garbage and recycling bins to parked vehicles and trailers.

The Town plows are not permitted to perform any snow removal on private property due to insurance liability, please do not stop the drivers to ask them to do so. During the course of snow removal in private drives, parking lots, and driveways; please do not push the snow back into the road ways as this may create traffic hazards.
