# projects and improvements updates From Jill Murr Town Administrator

The 2015 Road Projects throughout Town which began the week of September 21st have been completed. Public Works is finishing up any stone work that may be needed along the edge of the roadways. The thirty (30) streets on the list were completed as well as a few more. In conjunction with the contractor Rieth-Riley; Public Works staff completed culvert replacements and drainage work.

Parrish Avenue Road Construction from 137th Avenue to 141st Avenue which began Friday, September 11th and re-opened on Friday, October 30th. We appreciate everyone's patience during the road closure and during this project. While there is some restoration work that will need to be completed in the spring, we can all enjoy the new roadway and sidewalks in the area. Staff, Town Council and the Town's engineer will be working on the plans and design for continuing the improvements along Parrish Avenue as well as working with the Clerk-Treasurer to identify the funding for the next phase.

133rd Evenue Westside - Road construction and improvements on 133rd Avenue Westside from US-41 to Industrial Avenue while the majority of the work from US-41 to the railroad tracks is substantially complete; work remains east of the railroad tracks to Industrial Drive. A solution and plan to the drainage issues was worked on collaboratively with INDOT and Engineers. Work began this fall, curbs were raised, pavement was raised and during the first week of December, the drainage component of the project, a box culvert which goes across the roadway from the north to the south, was installed. While the roadway has not received its final surface coat of asphalt

# Dag Tag Renewal

Dog owners are required to renew their licenses annually at the Clerk-Treasurer's Office located at 7408 Constitution Avenue during business hours, Monday-Friday 8AM-5PM. During the months of January through March 31st, the cost is \$10 per dog with a maximum of three dogs permitted at each residence. After March 31st, the cost will be \$15 per dog. A valid rabies certification is required in order to renew the license. It is the responsibility of the dog owner to ensure that the rabies shots are renewed per veterinarian's certificate. For those who are unable to come to the Town Hall to renew the dog license, we will accept a copy of the valid rabies certificate, and payment by check, through the mail or the drop box at our parking lot. Upon receipt of your information and payment, we will process your license and mail it to you. For more information, please call our office at (219) 374-7000.
