Online bank payment services

Avoiding Late Fees with Utility Payment Conveniences

The banks issue a physical

check and send it to us by U.S. Mail. This may take a few days before the town actually

receives the payment. The Utility Billing Department collects mail every business day to ensure payments are credited to your accounts on the day it is received. However, we cannot be responsible for the actions of the banks or the postal service. If a holiday occurs within the time frame, please consider this when processing your online payment with the bank.

Utility bills are due by the tenth (10th) of the month with a ten (10) day grace period before the delinquent date occurs. After the twentieth (20th) of the month, the bill is considered past due and a penalty will be applied to the account. If this date falls on a weekend or holiday, the next business day is considered the delinquent date. Always confirm that your utility account number is accurately entered on the bank's payment site before the payment is submitted. The bank will send us this payment by mail with the account number as a reference. Having the correct account number available ensures that your payment is posted accordingly.

To avoid the possibility of delayed payment, we recommend using one of the town's features.

Sign up for auto withdrawal by submitting the completed form with a voided check. The form is available on our website or by contacting us directly. Payment will be electronically withdrawn from your account on the fifteenth (15th) of the month or next business day. This service is free of charge.

Police Department Consolidates its Dispatch Center

The Cedar Lake Police Department consolidated its dispatch center as required by State Law. As a result dispatchers are no longer working out of our location.

Our records department is open from Monday – Friday 8 AM to 5 PM and Saturday 7 AM to 3 PM closed on Sunday and holidays. The station has a call box which can be used to contact the dispatch center after regular business hours.

You can still call 219-374-5416 at any time and listen to the recordings to be directed to the person or department you are trying to reach. You can also reach our dispatch center from this number by pressing 5 during the greeting.

As always if you have an emergency dial 911, however 911 isn't just for emergencies anymore. If you need the services of the police, ambulance, or fire department call 911 to be directed to the dispatch center.

When you call 911:

- Describe the emergency; speak slowly and calmly
- Give your name and phone number
- Give exact location and address and nearby landmarks
- Give name, age and number of patient(s), if known
- Follow the dispatcher's instructions and answer all questions
- Don't hang up until you are told to do so
- Don't leave the scene until help arrives

O Dinter Driving Safety Tips

Stay home if you really don't have to go out!

But if you must go out remember to adjust your speed for the driving conditions:

- Always wear your seatbelt.
- Accelerate and decelerate slowly, it takes longer to slow down on icy roads.
- Allow extra space between you and other vehicles.
- Make sure your tires are properly inflated.
- Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface.
- Keep your gas tank at least half full, to avoid the gas line freezing up.
- Always carry your charged cell phone.
- Also keep extra hats, gloves, food, water and blankets in your car.

If you do become stranded, stay with your vehicle. Never try to walk in a storm.

Pay by phone 24/7 by calling toll free (855) 246-9327 and follow the automated instructions. A convenience fee is charged and retained by the vendor for processing the payment. Credit and debit cards are accepted. Make sure to have your bill available when calling. You may also call us directly to make a credit or debit card payment.

E-billing is also available to avoid any delays by the postal service. Your monthly utility bill will be emailed to you. Please call us if you are interested in signing up for this feature. There is no charge for this service.
