WARNING: IRS Phone Scam

An IRS phone scam is hitting the area again. The solution to this is simple, and so is the explanation. **The IRS will not call you** on the telephone! The IRS will not demand that you send payment or indicate any specific way in which you should send payment. The IRS will not get a warrant for your arrest, nor will they send the police to your house. If you receive these calls, hang up immediately and ignore these callers. The calls are from fake phone numbers and unfortunately cannot be traced.

Branch Pick-Up

The Cedar Lake Public Works Department collects tree branches once each month, starting April 1 and ending December 1, weather permitting. The town will be done in its entirety (typically within the first 10 days of the month) during the listed months. It is very important to have branches ready by 7 am by the first of each month.

Branch Collection Guidelines

- For safety reasons, branches must be at least 48 inches in length. Anything shorter is considered yard waste and should be cut up and deposited in the regular weekly trash collection.
- The Town's chipping equipment can safely process branches up to 8 inches in diameter.
- Grass, bricks, stones, metal objects, stumps or branches larger than 8 inches in diameter should not be placed in branch piles. These materials can damage the chipping equipment, which could result in injury to a Town employee. Branch piles will be bypassed if any improper items are noticed.
- Please do not mix leaves or yard waste with branches.
- Please do not bundle branches or place them in containers or bags.

- 1) Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the meter changes at all, you probably have a leak. Check your sprinkler system for winter damage.
- 2) Put a few drops of food coloring in the toilet tank; wait 10 minutes before flushing, and if color appears in the bowl, you have a leak.
- 3) Twist faucet valves, tighten pipe connections, and secure your hose to the spigot. For additional savings, twist a WaterSense labeled aerator onto each bathroom faucet to save water without noticing a difference in flow.
- 4) Replace old and leaky plumbing fixtures with WaterSense labeled models, which are independently certified to use 20 percent less water and perform as well or better than standard models. You can also replace irrigation clock timers with WaterSense labeled controllers that tell your sprinkler when and how much to water based on local weather conditions.
