Residential Dumpster Access

9 am to 1 pm at Public Works- Town Garage, 8550 Lakeshore Drive. Public Works will have dumpsters available for residents to drop off large items. Cleaning up and need to get rid of some stuff? They will be accepting large items such as televisions and refrigerators, construction debris (excluding concrete and railroad ties). Proof of residency will be required. Contact Public Works with questions (219) 374-7478. This program will continue on the 3rd Saturday each month through October. Household hazardous waste will not be accepted.

Household Hazardous Waste items include batteries, fluorescent tubes, oil based paint, automotive supplies, antifreeze, pesticides, and flammable liquids. Rain Barrel Event

Did you know that lawn and garden watering make up almost 40% of water usage during the summer months? A rain barrel collects water and stores it for when you need it most! Saving water not only helps protect the environment, it saves you money and energy. Diverting water from storm drains also decreases the impact of runoff to streams. Therefore, a rain barrel is an easy way for you to have a consistent supply of clean, fresh water for outdoor use and free. The Town of Cedar Lake will work with UpCycle Products to host a rain barrel event for Earth Day, April 22nd! A link will be placed on the town’s site, www.cedarlakein.org, which will allow you to pre-order your rain barrel for this spring! Prices start from \$56.50 for a 55 gallon barrel and range with the type of product. Rain barrels come in black, grey, blue, and terra cotta. Pre-ordered rain barrels will be available for pick up on Earth Day, Friday, April 22 from 2 to 5 pm at the Cedar Lake Town Hall, 7408 Constitution Avenue. Delivery and installation is also offered through UpCycle Products.



Crack Sealing Schedule

The Cedar Lake Public Works Department will be crack sealing the roads throughout the town in March and April. The purpose of crack sealing is to fill in cracks in the road with emulsion to maintain their longevity. During this maintenance there will be several trucks, workers and flaggers working around the road. Please drive slowly and cautiously, obey traffic flaggers during these times. What can I Recycle?

YES, it’s recyclable!

- Paper (Wet Paper Is Not Accepted)
- Magazines & junk mail
- Computer paper
- Corrugated cardboard boxes (no waxed cardboard)
- Cereal & gift boxes
- Paper bags & phone books
- Wrapping paper

CONTAINERS- EMPTY AND RINSE OUT ALL CONTAINERS

- Aluminum cans (soda & beer)
- Plastic bottles (clear & green)
- Colored containers
- Glass bottles (clear & brown)
- Food & beauty containers

NO, it’s not recyclable!

- Plastic bags (accepted at most grocery chains)
- Electronics (accepted at Public Works; 8550 Lakeshore Drive)
- Batteries (accepted at Town Hall)
- Plastic toys
- Construction debris
- Dishware/ceramics
- Garden hoses

All recyclables must be loose, not in plastic bags. Please have your garbage and recyclables out by 6:00 AM Monday morning. Did you know that 1 large item a week is accepted, excluding electronics and refrigerants? Carpet, wood and trees must be cut into 4 foot sections and bundled. If a large amount of trash is going to be curbside, please contact GMI to make arrangements for pick up, contact GMI Services at (219) 252-0392.

Hydrant Flushing to begin early April

The Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants beginning early April. “Hydrant Flushing” signs will be placed 24 hours in advance for every area being flushed. Additionally, they will have signs denoting ‘hydrant flushing today’ in all areas where the hydrants are being flushed that day. Hydrant flushing is necessary to test water pressure and flow from all fire hydrants, as well as removing sediment from the water mains. It is common for some areas to see discolored water during and immediately after hydrant flushing. When this happens, the best course of action would be to run the cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clears. Sometimes it may be necessary to repeat this a few times if the sediment was high in that area.

Q: What should I do if my water pressure seems low after flushing?

A: Check your faucet screens and house filters for debris.

Q: What should I do when I see crews flushing hydrants in my neighborhood?

A: Please drive carefully and slowly. Remember, a large volume of water is used during flushing, and it may be deeper than it seems, so use caution and drive slowly through the water in the roadway.
