Mosquito Bite Prevention

Protect yourself and your family from mosquito bites. Not all mosquitoes are the same. Different mosquitoes spread different viruses and bite at different times of the day.

Type of mosquito:	Viruses spread:	Biting habits:
Aedes aegyoti	Chikungunya, Dengue, Zika	Primarily daytime, but can also bite at night
Culex species	West Nile	Evening to morning – do not bite at night

What type of insect repellent should I use?

- For protection against ticks and mosquitoes: use a repellent that contains 20% or more DEET for protection that lasts up to several hours. Products containing DEET include Off!, Cutter, Sawyer, and Ultrathon.
- For protection against mosquitoes only: products with one of the following active ingredients can also help prevent mosquito bites. Higher percentages of active ingredient provide longer protection.
 - DEET
 - Picaridin (also known as KBR 3023, Bayrepel, and picaridin. Products containing picaridin include: Cutter Advanced, Skin So Soft Bug Guard Plus, and Autan [outside the US])
 - Oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) or PMD (Products containing OLE include Repel and Off! Botanicals)
 - IR3535 (Products containing IR3535 include Skin So Soft Bug Guard Plus Expedition and SkinSmart)
- Always follow product directions and reapply as directed.
- If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.
- Follow package directions when applying repellent on children. Avoid applying repellent to their hands, eyes, and mouth.
- Consider using permethrin-treated clothing and gear (such as boots, pants, socks, and tents). You can buy pre-treated clothing and gear or treat them yourself.
 - Treated clothing remains protective after multiple washings.
 - See the product information to find out how long the protection will last.
 - If treating items yourself, follow the product instructions carefully.
 - Do not use permethrin directly on skin.

Mosquito-proof your home: Repair holes in any screens to keep mosquitoes outside. Use air conditioning when available. Keep mosquitoes from laying eggs in and near standing water: once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flower pots, or trash containers. Check inside and outside your home.

If you happen to come across any of the items in the list below, and you need to dispose of them, the Lake County Solid Waste Management District has a schedule of dates, times and locations for hazardous material collections in Northwest Indiana. Items accepted at these collections include (but are not limited to) aerosols, ammunition, antifreeze, oils, batteries, medications, fluorescent tubes, paint, pesticides or other poisons and flammable liquids.

There will be NO hazardous material collections at the Public Works Dept. However, we will have our second Saturday of residential dumpster access on Saturday May 21st, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Residents will be asked to present identification or proof of Cedar Lake residence and sign in, just as you would during regular business hours (M – F, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.).

Saturday schedules for residential dumpster access can also be picked up at the Public Works Dept. Office or you can call/email Sara for information.

We always have an electronic waste collection for all Lake County residents; please recycle your old televisions, computers, keyboards, mice, printers, hand-held devices, video game consoles, or VCR's!
