Ecasystem Restaration

For more than several decades, the Town, Cedar Lake Enhancement Association (CLEA) and local organizations, have been working with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Chicago District in the development of a plan to restore Cedar Lake's ecosystem.

On April 28, 2016, the Town received news that the Department of the Army, Office of the Assistant Secretary, Civil Works, approved an exception to allow for the Locally Preferred Plan (LPP). This allows for US Army Corp of Engineers to proceed with the LPP.

On May 13, 2016, Town Council Member John Foreman, Town Administrator Jill Murr and Kay Whitlock of Christopher B. Burke Engineering, met with U.S. Army Corp of Engineers in Chicago to discuss the next steps and timeline for this joint project.

In the coming months, the Town will be preparing for public meeting review of the Ecosystem Restoration Plan. This meeting is anticipated to occur in the near future.

Recreational Fires

In recent years, backyard fires have become more common in suburban areas, where the confines are much tighter than you'd find in the "great outdoors". As a result, the Town of Cedar Lake has put Fire Codes in place to address this and related issues: Town of Cedar Lake Ordinance 93.40-93.42 and Indiana Fire Code 307. Remember, recreational fires are a privilege, not a right. With this privilege comes responsibilities that must be upheld in order for you, your friends, neighbors and children to safely enjoy a summer fire. Fire prevention and education are two of the Fire Department's top priorities. Usually, many burn injuries, fatal fires or property damage could be prevented by adhering to the following recreational fire guidelines:

- Fires must be on private property and contained within a fire ring, pit or manufactured wood-burning appliance or similar device constructed for such use.
- Any recreational fires must be at least 25 feet from all structures, 10 feet away from property lines, and 5 feet from any combustibles.
- Keep a fire extinguisher, hose or bucket of water near your fire at all times.
- You are only allowed to burn clean wood.
- Oils, combustible and flammable liquids, rubber, plastics, chemically treated materials, construction materials, hazardous waste and rubbish/trash, yard waste shall not be burned. Do not use flammable or combustible liquids to kindle or rekindle a fire.
- Keep your fire no larger than three feet in diameter by two feet high.
- Do not start a recreational fire if winds exceed 15 mph.
- Your fire must be attended at all times by at least one responsible person 18 years of age or older.
- As a courtesy to your neighbors, please let them know when you intend to
- Make sure your fire is completely extinguished before leaving it unattended.

If the Fire Department receives complaints about the fire or it constitutes a hazardous condition, the Fire Chief or one of his designated Officer's is authorized to have the fire discontinued immediately. 

Summer Activities & Safety

Bicycle And Pedestrian Safety.

The Cedar Lake Police Department wants to remind everyone about bicycle and pedestrian safety. Driving on roads requires care and courtesy whether you are driving a car or a bicycle.

- Did you know bicyclists can ride on all roads, except where restricted? Bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as motorists, including the right to ride in the traffic lane.
- It is illegal and unsafe for bicyclists to ride against (or facing) traffic. Bicyclists should ride on the road, and must ride in the same direction as traffic.
- · Motorists must maintain at least three feet of clearance when passing a bicyclist.
- When a road is too narrow for cars and bikes to ride safely side by side, bicycles should take the travel lane, which means riding in or near the center of the lane.
- Bicyclists must obey all traffic controls, signs and signals. It's the law.

Know the Facts

- In most states, a bicycle is considered a "vehicle" (like cars, trucks and motorcycles). All bike riders must follow and obey the same laws as the drivers of other vehicles.
- Many pedestrian crossings are marked with a sign saying "Yield to Pedestrians," reminding motorists that pedestrians have the right-of-way. However, motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks even if they're not marked.
- The biggest difference between motorists and bicyclists as road users is that bicyclists are less visible, quieter and don't have a crumple zone to protect them.

- Stay alert-avoid all distractions while driving.
- Yield to bicyclists when turning.
- In bad weather, give bicyclists extra passing room, just as you would other motorists.
- Make a visual check for bicyclists by checking mirrors and blind spots before entering or leaving a lane of traffic.
- Slow down and give at least 3 feet of clearance when passing.
- Reduce your speed when passing bicyclists, especially when the road is narrow.
- NEVER honk your horn at a bicyclist-it could cause them to swerve into traffic or off the roadway and crash.
- Always check for bicyclists before opening your car door. • Children on bicycles are often unpredictable-expect the unexpected.

- Ride on the roadway or shared pathways, rather than on sidewalks.
- Follow the same rules of the road as other roadway users, including riding in the same direction as traffic and following all the same traffic signs and signals.
- Wear a bicycle helmet every time and on every ride.
- Be visible by wearing bright colors during the day, reflective gear in low light conditions, and use head and tail lights at night.
- Remember that respect is a two way street. Show motorists the same courtesy that you expect from them.

- Walking along roadways if a sidewalk is provided and the sidewalk's use is practicable, a pedestrian may not walk along and upon an adjacent highway
- If a sidewalk is not available, a pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall walk only on a shoulder, as far as practicable from the edge of the roadway and
- Crosswalks must be used when available and pedestrians must yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway. Crosswalk signals must be followed.
- It is always responsible to walk at night wearing bright reflecting clothing and you should also be wearing or carrying a light.
