A Note From The Fire Department On Grill Safety

Fire in the grill, under hot dogs and burgers, is a welcome sight at the family cookout. But fire anywhere else can make your summer kick-off barbecue memorable for all the wrong reasons. The National Fire Protection Association shares some general grilling tips to keep you and your family safe this summer: propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors; the grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches; keep children and pets away from the grill area; keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill and never leave your grill unattended. Guy Colonna, NFPA Division Manager, Industrial & Chemical Engineering, gives some basic tips on how to prepare your grill before your first cookout of the season.

- Check the major connection points between the gas (propane) tank hose and the regulator and cylinder, and where the hose connects to the burners. Tighten if loose.
- Check the gas (propane) tank hose for the potential (gas) leaks. To do that: Turn the propane tank on. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose using a brush or spray bottle. If there is a gas leak, the propane will release bubbles around the hose (big enough to see).
- Once you've determined your grill has a gas leak by smell or by administering the soapy bubble test and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and burners. If the leak stops at that point, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak doesn't stop, call the fire department immediately.
- If you smell gas while cooking, move away from the grill and call the fire department immediately. Do not move the grill.



Message from Public Works

Just a friendly reminder... the Public Works Department collects tree branches at the beginning of each month which started in April and will continue through December. The town's branch pickups will be completed, in its entirety, within the first 10 business days of the month (however, it may take fewer days) weather permitting. It is very important to have branches ready by 7 AM by the first of each month to ensure collection.

Saturday July 16th, Public Works will be open from 9:00am to 1:00 pm if anyone has large items to dispose of and such items include but aren't limited to: furniture, carpet, wood and appliances. Just as we ask residents to sign in upon a visit during the week, on these dates we'll have you sign in as well, presenting identification or a utility bill as to prevent non-residents from taking advantage of this service.

From the Water Dept.... Be mindful of outdoor leaks! If you left a garden hose connected over the winter, there is a good chance your pipes will burst in the spring. Check each hose bibb before you turn it on to make sure none of the pipes were damaged by frost during the winter. Leaks can lead to high water bills each month and water damage inside and outside your home.
