### FIREWORK RECOMMENDED SAFETY TIPS

- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Know your fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting.
- A responsible adult SHOULD supervise all firework activities. Never give fireworks to children.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- · Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.
- Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away.
- Use fireworks OUTDOORS in a clear area; away from buildings and vehicles.
- Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby.
- Never carry fireworks in your POCKET or shoot them into METAL or GLASS containers.
- Do not experiment with homemade fireworks.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and place in a metal trash can away from any building or combustible materials until the next day.
- Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter sticks, to the fire or police department.

FIREWORKS TOWN ORDINANCE (102.03)

DAYS OF USE: June 29th, 30th & July 1st-9th

TIME OF USE: Between 5:00 pm and two hours after sunset (11:00 pm)

JULY 4 FROM 10:00 AM TO 12:00 MIDNIGHT

Fireworks can only be used on property owned by person or with permission and by someone over age of 18 years unless with parent.

**CONSUMER FIREWORKS** 

Types of 1.4 fireworks (previously known as "Class C")

- Consumer = certain types of 1.4G fireworks (bottle rockets, roman candles, and fire crackers)
- Sec. 8(a) = sparklers, ground spinners, cone fountains, wheels, cylindrical fountains

SPECIAL FIREWORKS-permit required

- Special fireworks = 1.3G \_reworks for which a permit from the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives shall be obtained prior to purchase, storage, or use.

#### A NOTE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT ON GRILL SAFETY

Everyone loves a good steak or some corn on a hot fired grill, but fire anywhere else can make your summer kick-off barbecue memorable for all the wrong reasons. The National

Fire Protection Association shares some

general grilling tips to keep you and your family safe this summer: propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors, the grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches, keep children and pets away from the grill area, keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill, never leave your grill unattended.

## A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS BRANCH PICK-UP

The Public Works Department collects tree branches at the beginning of each month through December. The Town's branch pickups will be completed, in its entirety, within the first 10 business days of the month, weather permitting. It is very important to have branches ready by 7 am by the first of each month to ensure collection. The Town's branch pickup service is for residents who perform regular maintenance on their property with small to medium size piles of branches. This service allows residents an appropriate way to dispose of green waste, it is not intended to supplement or compete with private contractors.
