Parrish Avenue – 141st to 151st

The Town has worked diligently to prepare for the reconstruction of Parrish Avenue – 141st to 151st Avenue. We are excited to announce this project to begin this Spring! Jill Murr, Town Administrator, worked diligently to secure grant funding for this project. The hard work paid off and the Town was awarded a \$690,000 Community Crossing Matching Grant to be utilized for this ~\$1.6M reconstruction project. The scope of work includes a full roadway reconstruction and intersection improvements.

Walsh & Kelly were awarded the bid on the project, we look forward to notifying you of the schedule as we get closer.

Lincoln Plaza Entrance Improvement Project

Lincoln Plaza Entrance Improvement Project is another sign of advancement of the Town. The Redevelopment Commission is investing ~ \$500,000 into this entranceway renovation and improvement project.

A Message from your Police Department...

As spring approaches the Cedar Lake Police Department would like to remind our residents to obey the posted speed limits, which are generally 30 MPH on main roads and 20 MPH on subdivision roads and congested areas, as well as school zones. The Police Department will be utilizing our radar speed sign, weather permitting, in certain areas.

With spring and summer approaching the Cedar Lake Police Department will also be aggressively working on ordinance violations within the town. As a reminder some of the most common violations are: Abandoned vehicles, unauthorized accumulation, and tall weeds / grass. As a reminder to our citizens concerning a number of telephone scams. The IRS, NIPSCO or any other legitimate company will never call you on the phone and ask you to send money via a pre-paid gift card. If you receive such a telephone call and the caller is advising you of a balance due and threatening you with arrest or disconnection of services unless you pay immediately via a pre-paid card disconnect the call immediately and call that service provider direct or call the police. No service provider has the authority to send the police to arrest you, not even the IRS.

Hydrant Flushing to begin early April

The Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants beginning early April. "Hydrant Flushing" signs will be placed 24 hours in advance for every area being flushed. Additionally, they will have signs indicating 'hydrant flushing today' in all areas where the hydrants are being flushed that day. Hydrant flushing is necessary to test water pressure and flow from all fire hydrants, as well as removing sediment from the water mains. It is common for some areas to see discolored water during and immediately after hydrant flushing. When this happens, the best course of action would be to run the cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clears. Sometimes it may be necessary to repeat this a few times if the sediment was high in that area.

Q: What should I do if my water pressure seems low after flushing?

A: Check your faucet screens and house filters for debris.

Q: What should I do when I see crews flushing hydrants in my neighborhood?

A: Please drive carefully and slowly. Remember, a large volume of water is used during flushing, and it may be deeper that it seems, so use caution and drive slowly through the water in the roadway.

- Plastic bags (accepted at most Grocery Chains)
- Electronics (accepted at Public Works; 8550 Lakeshore Drive)
- Batteries (accepted at Town Hall)

- Dishware/Ceramics
- Garden hoses

All Recyclables must be loose, not in plastic bags. Please have your garbage and recyclables out by **6:00 AM** Monday morning. Did you know that 1 large item a week is accepted, excluding electronics and refrigerants? Carpet, wood and trees must be cut into 4 foot sections and bundled.
