**To Submit a Locate Request 24 Hours a Day, Seven Days a Week:  
Call 811 or 800-382-5544**

Digging can be an expensive and potentially dangerous venture. Underground facilities are extremely vulnerable to damage during any type of excavating. Each year millions of dollars in property damage, personal injuries and even loss of life occur because of careless digging, boring and blasting when underground facilities were not located prior to excavating. With each passing year, more and more lines are being installed and the problems increase for everyone involved.

1. Call 811, 1-800-382-5544
2. Wait for member facility owners/operators to mark the proposed excavation site.
3. Respect the marks. There is a 2 foot hand dig zone on either side of the marked buried facility that extreme care must be taken, and only hand or vacuum excavation is allowed in this zone.
4. Dig with care.

### A Message from Public Works

Branch pickup has begun! The entire Town's branches will be picked up typically within the first 10 business days of each month. To ensure that branches get picked up, please have them ready by 7:00 am, the first business day of each month through December 1st.

### Residential Dumpster Access

9:00 am to 1:00 pm at Public Works - Town Garage, 8550 Lakeshore Drive. Public Works will have dumpsters available for residents to drop off large items. We will be accepting large items such as televisions and refrigerators, construction debris (excluding concrete, and railroad ties). Proof of residency will be required. Contact Public Works with questions (219) 374-7478. This program will continue on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday each month through October. Household hazardous waste will not be accepted.

### Lake County Solid Waste

Lake County Solid Waste Management has their 2018 household hazardous waste collection schedule available on their website. ### A Message from your Police Department

With nicer weather comes more opportunities for property crimes. The Police Department wants to remind residents to lock their vehicles wherever they go, especially at home overnight. Do not leave expensive items or personal property inside your vehicle in plain sight. It is a common crime in the area for people to go around throughout the night checking for unlocked vehicle and property inside to take. These simple step could prevent you from becoming a victim. Also if you stop for gasoline, always shut off your vehicle and lock your doors. Thefts occur while you are pumping gasoline and leave your valuables inside your vehicle, people approach the opposite side of your vehicle and reach inside by opening your door without you noticing. This is especially relevant to women who leave their purse on the passenger seat.

The Police Department will be utilizing their digital speed radar sign in various areas throughout the Town. Please pay attention to the speed limits as children will be out playing more as the weather becomes nicer. The speed limit in congested areas and subdivisions is 20 MPH by town ordinance.
