Golf Cart Ordinance

The Cedar Lake Police Department wants to remind residents of the new Golf Cart Ordinance established December 19, 2017 by the Town Council. You are required to get a permit at the Cedar Lake Police Department for a \$10.00 fee. The sticker must be affixed to the golf cart. When you register your golf cart, you will be provided with a list of the current rules and regulations. Golf carts can only be operated on residential streets where the speed limit does not exceed 25 mph. A copy of the Ordinance can be found on the Town's web page at www.cedarlakein.org.

Speed Limits

During the summer months, there will be a number of streets under construction. These are improvements that will benefit every resident of Cedar Lake. We are asking for your cooperation in abiding by posted speed limits. We ask that you have consideration for residents who live in the area when using detours and while driving through these construction areas. Generally, the speed limit is 20 mph in these areas.

Safety

As a reminder keep your vehicles locked and do not leave valuables inside your vehicles overnight. If you see suspicious persons in or around your neighborhood at night, notify the police by calling 911 immediately.

Keeping citizens informed.

The "CodeRED" high speed telephone emergency notification service is now available for Cedar Lake residents. It gives officials the ability to deliver emergency telephone notification/information messages to targeted areas or the whole Town with a rate of up to 60,000 calls per hour.

All residents and businesses are urged to log on the Town's website (cedarlakein.org) and follow the link to the "CodeRED" page. This is where you will be able to register and make modifications for different notifications. Required information will include first and last name, street address (no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code and a primary phone number.

The alert system will send text and voice messages or even email about local emergencies, road closures and more.

There is also a "CodeRED" App, the mobile alert app is simple to use. As a resident or visitor, you can download the free app on your smartphone. When a public safety

official initiates a notification to the app using CodeRED, you'll receive a push notification directly to your phone. The App will also work coherently when traveling to or through other Towns or Cities that use this notification system. A MESSAGE FROM YOUR FIRE DEPARTMENT

Recreational Fires

In recent years, backyard fires have become more common in suburban areas, where the confines are much tighter than you'd find in the "great outdoors." As a result, the Town of Cedar Lake has put Fire Codes in place to address this and related issues: Town of Cedar Lake Ordinance 93.40-93.42 and Indiana Fire Code 307. Usually, many burn injuries, fatal fires or property damage could have been prevented by adhering to the following recreational fire quidelines:

- Fires must be on private property and contained within a fire ring, pit or manufactured wood-burning appliance or similar device constructed for such use.
- Any recreational fires must be at least 25 feet from all structures, 10 feet away from property lines, and 5 feet from any combustibles.
- Keep a fire extinguisher, hose or bucket of water near vour fire at all times.
- You are only allowed to burn clean wood.

- Oils, combustible and flammable liquids, rubber, plastics, chemically treated materials, construction materials, hazardous waste and rubbish/trash, yard waste shall not be burned. Do not use flammable or combustible liquids to kindle or rekindle a fire.
- Keep your fire no larger than three feet in diameter by two feet high.
- Do not start a recreational fire if winds exceed 15 mph.
- Your fire must be attended at all times by at least one responsible person 18 years of age or older.
- As a courtesy to your neighbors, please let them know when you intend to have a fire.
- Make sure your fire is completely extinguished before leaving it unattended.

If the Fire Department receives complaints about the fire or it constitutes a hazardous condition, the Fire Chief or one of his designated Officer's is authorized to have the fire discontinued immediately.
