Road Construction, Detours and Dust - We Have Been Busy

The Town's infrastructure and reconstruction improvement projects of 2018 are wrapping up. 2018 has been a busy year with nearly \$8 Million in roadway and infrastructure improvements with more to come. Thank you to all for your patience as improvements were made around Town.

Lake Shore Drive/Cline Avenue Intersection Improvement/Roundabout Project

The \$2.9M Lake Shore Drive/Cline Avenue Intersection Improvement Roundabout project was awarded by INDOT to Walsh & Kelly. Almost \$1.9M in federal funding has been awarded for this improvement project. The Town

received approval from INDOT and NIRPC to fund this construction project three years earlier than anticipated. Town Administrator Jill Murr continually represents the Town, communicating with NIRPC and INDOT representatives which helped to expedite this project into INDOT's fiscal year 2019 instead of 2022. Utility Relocation Work in the area is anticipated to begin in the coming months.

Parrish Avenue – 141st to 151st

A full roadway reconstruction and intersection improvements were the scope of the ~\$1.3M Parrish Avenue – 141st to 151st project. The Town received a \$529,550 Community Crossing Matching Grant for this project. As of the writing of this newsletter, improvements and paving are continuing. The roadway will be open soon.

Subdivision Roadway Improvements

The ~\$4.2M High Grove Subdivision and the ~\$3.1M South Shore Subdivision projects are having the finishing touches completed. Both projects included roadway and infrastructure improvements. Additionally, NIPSCO and its subcontractors replaced gas mains and service lines in these areas as a separate project.

Lincoln Plaza Entrance Improvement Project

The Lincoln Plaza Entrance Improvement Project is another sign of advancement of the Town. The Redevelopment Commission has invested ~ \$500,000 into this

LEAF COLLECTION

Leaf vac trucks will be out each week for the duration of leaf-pick-up season which began October 1st and will end mid-December. Leaf piles must be no more than 6 feet from the street (due to the length of the vac truck hose) and without blocking any waterways or storm drains. Residents are welcome to dispose of leaves at the Public Works Department, Monday through Friday from 7 am to 3 pm; please stop in the main office first to present your driver's license and/or your most recent Cedar Lake utility bill for proof of property ownership in Cedar Lake. Please call Public Works at (219) 374-7478 if you have questions.

- Place the leaf piles along the curbside within six (6) feet of the street.
- Do not park vehicles within ten (10) feet of the leaf pile.
- Do not mix leaves with yard waste, branches, stones or branches; leaf piles will be bypassed if any improper items are noticed.
- If you wish to bag leaves, use brown yard waste bags; we will not pick up leaves in any other container.
- **Calling when yard work is complete is not necessary.**
