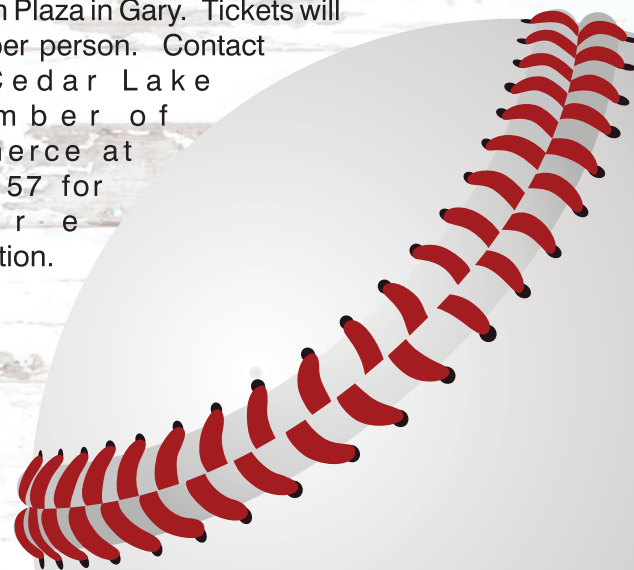

STORM SEWER VS. SANITARY SEWER: KNOW THE DIFFERENCE

Storm sewers collect rain water, snow melt, water from washing cars, and any water running along the side of the road into a storm drain.

Storm drains a.k.a. storm sewers have various shaped and sized grates usually with larger openings to allow water to enter the drain and the storm water system, but sometimes you'll find solid lids with the word “storm” on it. They look something like this



Water that enters the storm water system does not get treated; this water re-enters our natural bodies of water. Please be mindful to not pollute this system with chemicals, litter, or other wastes.

Remember this, “Only rain down the drain.”

Sanitary sewers collect and transport wastewater (sewage) from sinks, toilets, showers, washing machines, and dishwashers that flow out of our homes and into the main sanitary sewer system and out to the street or alleys around your home.

Sewers or manhole lids are generally found in streets or alleys and have solid covers over the access point as nothing should enter. Sanitary sewers a.k.a. manholes look like this



Waste water flows through the main sanitary sewer lines by gravity and force from lift stations to a wastewater treatment plant where the wastewater gets treated.

LAKE SHORE DRIVE AT CLINE AVENUE - ROUNDABOUT



An informational public forum was held May 14, 2019 to notify the community of the plans involving the roundabout at Lake Shore Drive and Cline Ave. Representatives from American StructurePoint spoke about the traffic flow, detours, and the timeline of the project. They stated utility relocation was being done now in preparation for the project. The project will begin after the 4th of July and project anticipated completion date is the end of November. A traffic light will be in place, as roads will be down to one lane and detoured in locations during construction. A preemption device will be present for emergency vehicles. Boat traffic to the access site next to the Chamber of Commerce will be maintained throughout the project. Representatives were present to answer specific questions after the presentation.
