Keeping citizens informed

The "CodeRED" high speed telephone emergency notification service is available for Cedar Lake residents. It gives officials the ability to deliver emergency telephone notification/information messages to targeted areas or the whole Town. All residents and businesses are urged to log on the Town's website (cedarlakein.org) and follow the link to the "CodeRED" page. This is where you will be able to register and make modifications for different notifications. The alert system will send text, voice, or email messages about local emergencies, road closures and more. There is also a "CodeRED" App, which you can download the free app on your smartphone. When a public safety official initiates a notification, you'll receive a push notification directly to your phone. The App will also work coherently when traveling to or through other Towns or Cities that use this notification system. #### **LEAF COLLECTION:**

Leaf vacuum trucks will be out each week for the duration of leaf-pick-up season which began October 1st and will end mid-December. Public Works has a regular route starting at one end of town and continuing to the other end of town until the entire town is picked up/serviced; the department will then start their route over again. Residents are also able to dispose of leaves at the Public Works Department, Monday through Friday from 7a to 3p. as well as on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month from 9a to 1p. Please stop in the main office first to present your photo ID &/or your most recent Cedar Lake utility bill for proof of property ownership in Cedar Lake. Please call Public Works at (219) 374-7478 if you have questions. Calling when yard work is complete is not necessary.

- Place the leaf piles along the curbside within six (6) feet of the street (due to the length of the vac truck hose)
- Do not park vehicles within ten (10) feet of the leaf pile
- Do not block waterways or drainage
- Do not place leaves by mailboxes, trees, and power line wires/utility poles
- Do not mix leaves with yard waste, branches, stones or branches; leaf piles will be bypassed if any improper items are noticed
- If you wish to bag leaves, use brown yard waste bags; we will not pick up leaves in any other container
