# From the Desk of Chris Salatas, Town Manager

## Welcome, Chris Salatas, Town Manager!



I would like to start by introducing myself, Chris Salatas, as the new Town Manager succeeding Rick Eberly on February 7<sup>th</sup>. Previously I worked as the Town Manager for St. John, and before that I was a Regional Director for the U.S. Senate. Before then, I served on the Lowell Town Council for over six years; I am proud of the business growth, park upgrades, water, and road infrastructure repairs that we accomplished during that time. I earned my undergrad from IU in Political Science and am currently studying for my Masters in Business Administration from University of Arizona. I was attracted to Cedar Lake because of the great potential the community has and the numerous exciting infrastructure projects that are moving forward. I look forward to getting to know the community better and helping to make Cedar Lake the destination community of Lake County.

### Here is a list of projects that are on track and moving forward this year:

Lake Eco Restoration Project: This project is moving forward as planned with the Sediment Dewatering Facility construction being awarded to Dyer Construction. This facility will hold the dredged material from the lake while it dewaters before it can be moved.

Water Improvement Projects: The East Side water main transmission line and new water tower were awarded along with the Utopia water main replacement project. These projects are an investment to our water system to improve the municipal water delivery.

Public Safety Complex: The Town has selected to work with K2M to design the new building that will house the Fire and Police Departments with the design phase starting shortly. As the Town continues to grow it is important to have facilities that will adequately serve the needs of our first responders.

West Side Sanitary Sewer Interceptor Project (WSSSI) and Road Improvement Projects: Phase 1 of the WSSSI has been awarded and is on schedule. Similarly, the Road Improvement Projects for our Community Crossing Matching Grant are on schedule. We apologize in advance for the amount of orange traffic cones you are likely to see this year.
