From the Desk of Chris Salatas, Town Manager

What a whirlwind of a year 2022 was! To guote Ferris Bueller "life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss

The Town successfully completed its road paving projects last year and managed to complete more work than initially planned, given opportunities that presented themselves to the Town. This includes the Cline Avenue repaying, crack sealing throughout the Town, additional road striping, as well as utilizing the Town's newly purchased Total Patcher. We appreciated your patience as we all worked to navigate multiple road closures.

Our East side Water Main Project, Utopia Water Main Replacement Project, and East Side Water Tower Project are all kicking off or underway as well as the Town's exploratory well drilling project. Phase 1 of our West Side Sanitary Sewer Interceptor has also begun, and the Town is looking forward to starting Phase 2 as we work to finalize easement acquisition. The Town has seen tremendous growth over the years, and we strive to keep our utilities growing with the community.

The new Police Station and Fire Station Projects have received approval from the Town Council and GM Development has been contracted as the BOT (Build Operate Transfer) Developer. The Town secured a superb 3.91% interest rate on the two bonds given the Town's strong financial position. We are expecting to break ground on the projects early in the year with construction finishing in 2024.

The Lake Eco-System Restoration Project is underway as you know, and the Sediment Dewatering Facility has been completed. Dredge America has been selected to do the dredging of the Lake and the Town was able to secure an early start date of April 2023 from the State.

Last, but certainly not least, Cedar Lake's Extension of Services request for an increase Parks and Recreation budget received approval by the State. The Town will have a \$900,000 plus park budget next year in order to provide our residents with increased park amenities and services. Next year will be a critical moment for our new Park Board as they look to staff up the new department and set plans in motion that will benefit the community for years to come. We ask for your patience and input as we look build out our Park infrastructure.

The Cedar Lake Staff hopes all our residents had a safe and heartfelt Happy Holidays as we enjoyed serving you through 2022 and look forward to and wish you a joyous 2023. Please continue to "explore everyday" in your growing community!
