The Lake Ecosystem Restoration Project, specifically the dredging, is underway, and we are all very excited. For updates on the dredge project, you can scan the QR code, above right. Unfortunately, some safety issues have come up that need addressed: For the safety of all lake users, please boat or enjoy the lake in a responsible and safe manner so everyone can enjoy the lake and not harm themselves or the pipeline. It will be quite costly to you if you damage the pipeline, and you may inflict an injury to yourself, others, or your watercraft. See the first photo above where a boater lost their propeller into the pipeline for driving over it. Additionally, some jet skiers have been jumping the pipeline. The pipeline should not be used as a watercraft jumping object. It is dangerous for those jumping it; and anyone who damages the pipeline is responsible for its repair. Please enjoy summer safely!

FIREWORKS TOWN ORDINANCE (102.03)



July 4th from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight Fireworks can only be used on property owned by the person

or with permission & by someone 18 yrs. or older

Consumer Fireworks:

Small fireworks 50 milligrams or less of explosive composition & aerial devices containing 130 milligrams or less of explosive composition &Section 8(a) fireworks

Special Fireworks: (permit required to sell & use)

More than 130 milligrams of explosive composition, aerial shells containing more than 40 grams of pyrotechnic composition

*All fireworks must have distinctly & durably painted, stamped, printed or marked on the package, box or container exact nature & quantity of the

Pointers from Public Works

Mosquito Spraying: Spraying for mosquitoes began on June 12 and will continue until September. The spray schedule is Monday - Thursday, leaving Friday for a make-up day only due to weather conditions we may encounter during the week. The town is split into 4 different zones; 1 zone will be covered per night.

Branch Pickup: Branch pick up started the first week of April and will continue until the last run during the first week of October. Please do not put anything in brush pile other than sticks.
