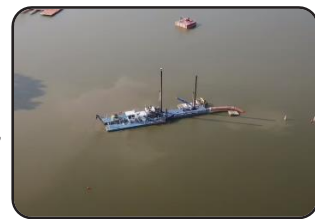
## From the Desk of Chris Salatas, Town Manager

Let me start by saying "Happy Fall" and "Happy Holidays"! I'm pleased to report on some exciting happenings around the town.

**Roadway Improvements:** Road construction started in Shades subdivision east of Morse Street and north of 141<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Required gas lines were moved and Milestone has begun their work. This two-phase project with improvements to 141<sup>st</sup> Avenue, Wheeler Street, and Berkley Street takes place this fall. The next phase will start in the spring for Edison Street, Rocklin Street, and Marys Lane. Sherman Street may be paved this fall, but will likely be done in the spring due to time and potential weather constraints.

**Lake Eco-Restoration:** The lake dredging is moving along. As of September 14th, approximately 179,000 cubic yards of sediment has been removed from the lake bed. The dredging will continue as long as weather permits and will start back up in the spring of 2024.

**Duck hunting season is about to start; for safety, blinds should be a minimum of 500 yards outside the dredging area.**

**Art in the Park:** Earlier in the year, the Town applied for and was awarded a Public Art and Placemaking Activation Grant. The art piece, called "The Cedar Lake Sundial," was designed and built by Mark Barnhart. The beautiful metal sculpture is nested atop a decorative stone pedestal near the lakefront and is accessible by a new sidewalk that frames the lakefront area of the Town Grounds and connects to the sidewalk that was already in place.
